

Bob Bernard was an enormously influential member of our racing community. In his own quest for excellence, his standards were high and he set his goals to pursue the best - while he might not have beaten Alberto Tomba, he saw no reason not to try to reach that level!

Beyond the enjoyment he found in his own racing, Bob supported the sport of ski racing with his involvement with USSA, the US ski team, and in the Far West. He was one of the founders along with Joe Lausmann of the Far West Masters scholarship fundraising program, which has grown into a very successful and appreciated program that helps support junior ski racers in the Far West.

For many years, no Masters championship event or race in the Far West was complete without Bob setting the standard for all us younger folk both on the race hill and off. In recent years he raced less often after health problems knocked him off the hill for a period, but he continued to have an active and satisfying life with family and travel as well as continuing to ski.

He will be deeply missed, yet his legacy lives on with all of us and he will not be forgotten. Bob was a fierce competitor, a good friend, and a true gentleman.

FWM Scholarship Program

The following article, taken directly from "First Tracks!! Online Ski Magazine talks about one of our former scholarship winners, and how she continues to contribute to our outstanding program.

<u>First Tracks!! Online Ski Magazine Article on Stacey Cook – "U.S. Ski Team's Stacey Cook</u> Raises Money for Children"

Scofield, UT – For the U.S. Ski Team's Stacey Cook (Mammoth, CA), running in the Scofield Triathlon on July was about more than triumphing over physical goals, it was also about giving back to organizations that helped her become the ski racer she is today.

Cook's participation in the triathlon was motivated by the athlete's desire to raise funds for the 49'ers Foundation and the Far West Masters Junior Scholarship Foundation; both are foundations targeted at helping youth in every-day life as well as in sports.

"The 49'ers Foundation does a lot of cool stuff for underprivileged children in the Bay Area. They're a great group where 100 percent of their donations go to children and they have gone as far as creating a school," Cook explained. "The Master's Foundation gives over 30 scholarships a year to kids in the far west. The Masters racers collect money over the season and then they distribute it in the fall to children. What they've been able to do in our region is amazing."

According to Cook, there was a special factor from her childhood that made her want to raise money for the Master's Foundation. "Well, when I was younger I received scholarships for multiple years from the Masters Foundation, so that was something that meant a lot to me to be able to give back because they mean so much to me and have allowed me to do what I love. For other kids in the area to experience that is special to me," Cook said.

In the end, Cook finished the marathon and says she plans on doing it again in the future.

"The swim was hard for a mountain girl like me, but I made it. Then the biking and the running was natural to me," Cook said. "It was tough but I had a smile on my face the whole time and I want to do it again."

Cook raised funds for the marathon through her website and split the proceeds between the two organizations.

"It's just something really small that I can do," Cook said

By the time our next edition is out, we'll know who the scholarship winners for 2008-09 will be, as the application deadline ends on Sept. 15. Last year, we had 53 athletes receive approximately \$35,000 from the FWM Scholarship Program, Inc. Since its founding over 15 years ago, we've raised more than \$260,000, and distributed it 100% to athletes.
