11-12 Schedule Highlights

Factoring in comments, concerns and kudos from past seasons, Mike Braun developed a schedule that has a little something for everyone. There are no back-toback race weekends; no races close to the December holidays; and we kept the three GS races in two days at Mammoth and Northstar. Far West Finals this year will be at Northstar for speed and Sugar Bowl for tech, banquet and duals.

The season kicks off on November 28 with the four-day Masters Camp at Mammoth Mountain, followed by a three-day weekend of Slalom and GS. Keeping the holiday season open, racing resumes in January with the Viva Italia Slaloms at Heavenly and Slalom and GS at Sierra at Tahoe. Back to Mammoth at the end of January for some speed at the "Rick Conrado Memorial Super-G Series," including National Speed Series races. February takes us to Northstar for GS and Mount Rose for the McKinney Cup. We will be at Squaw Valley in March for the Bernard Cup. Masters Nationals and Internationals take up the rest of March, and then we have our Far West Finals at Northstar and Sugar Bowl.
